

The Blood of Emmett Till discusses what happened in the lynching of a teenage black boy in 1955.

The Big Takeaways:

- 1. Pro-segregationists killed to defend their racist beliefs without fear.
 - If Being black meant that any kind of tension between you and another person could get you killed.
- 2. Bigotry is a learned behavior, not something people are born with.
 - 1. Black people were cautious about the way they acted in public as not to cross any lines that would land them in serious trouble.

- 3. After Emmett's abduction, his family demanded justice for him even though they were aware of the risks this posed.
 - 1. Emmett's mother, Mamie Bradley, knew Mississippi officials wouldn't help, so she contacted the press in Chicago, including black newspapers.
- 4. After Emmett Till's lynching, the power of media reached people and prompted them to seek justice for the boy.
 - Although some people took action, white supremacist groups continued their terror attacks against blacks.
- 5. Till received no justice, which only added fuel to the civil rights movement.
 - 1. The all-white jury showed explicit prejudice in the murder case, as did the biased evidence from the prosecution's side.
